

# WOMEX 2024 BURSARIES

# **APPLICATION GUIDANCE**

Deadline: 5pm, Thursday 9 May 2024



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#### What is WOMEX?

**WOMEX** (Worldwide Music Expo) sees over 2,600 professionals (including 260 performing artists) come together every October from 90 countries, making the event a key networking platform for the world music industry. Its musical spectrum ranges from the most traditional to the new global underground, embracing folk, roots, jazz, local and diaspora cultures alongside urban and electronic sounds from all over the globe.

WOMEX 2024 will take place in Manchester, England from 23-27 October.

#### **Creative Scotland at WOMEX**

**Creative Scotland's presence at WOMEX is part of a UK partnership**, between Arts Council England, Wales Arts International, Arts Council Northern Ireland and Culture Ireland, entitled **Horizons**. The UK and Ireland will host an area of stands at the conference where people can come and meet industry representatives and easily distinguish between each partner country's offering.

In 2024 Creative Scotland will play a part in delivering the Horizons stage which is set to feature two artists from Scotland showcasing alongside two from Wales, two from Ireland/Northern Ireland and three from England.

#### **Bursaries**

Creative Scotland is offering **eight bursaries** to those working in the sector to attend this event to build and strengthen their international networks.

#### All bursary recipients will receive:

- A £500 contribution towards registration, travel and accommodation costs which will be booked by the applicant themselves
- Inclusion in promotional material produced by Creative Scotland
- Pre-event briefings and support, including connection with other UK and Ireland-wide delegates
- Access support costs, as required.

### Who can apply?

- Applicants must be individuals or organisations working in traditional, folk, roots, world or Americana music in Scotland and/or Scotland's indigenous languages.
- Applicants must be currently resident in Scotland proof of address will be required.
- Applicants must be first or second-time attendees at WOMEX or engaging with the event in a new capacity from previous attendance.

### **Bursary recipient requirements**

All bursary recipients are required to:

- Commit to attending at least three days of WOMEX 2024 in person, however ability to attend the whole event is preferable
- Participate in pre-event briefing sessions with other delegates before the event
- Provide feedback after the event as requested
- Assist on the trade fair stand this will be no more than six hours in total over the course of the conference and will fit with other plans and commitments that you have.

## **Selection process**

The selection will be made by Creative Scotland staff alongside a panel of independent experts from within the traditional music sector.
